

Bree Collaborative Implementation Survey Results | Medical Group Potentially Avoidable Hospital Readmissions

This report summarizes adoption of the Bree Collaborative Potentially Avoidable Hospital Readmissions Recommendations, completed by Washington State medical groups in 2016. We measured adoption of specific recommendations using 0-3 point scale, self-assessed by each medical group.

Results: 11 Medical Groups Responding

0 -No action taken; **1** -Actively considering adoption; **2** -Some/similar adoption; **3** -Full adoption

Primary Care Providers receive notification of patients admitted to a hospital, or are seen in the hospital's Emergency Department; Necessary medical information is provided to the hospital care team	2.73
Primary Care Providers receive notification of patients discharged from a hospital, with a care plan, for patients at a high or moderate risk for readmission; Follow-up appointments are scheduled	2.83
Primary Care Providers have an effective process for obtaining medication lists and conducting medication reconciliation for discharged hospital patients	2.55
Primary Care Providers have a process for providing necessary follow-up visits for discharged hospital patients who do not currently have an established PCP	1.91

Scale

We measured adoption of specific recommendations using 0-3 point scale, self-assessed by each medical groups.

1 - Actively considering adoption	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Bree topics, aims and components have been discussed • Education, assessment, information gathering • Changes planned but not tested • Information gathering and baseline measurement begun
2 - Some/similar adoption	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Initial test cycles completed for more than one element • Quality metrics and data available demonstrating adoption/effectiveness • Other similar (Bree-like) changes adopted for this topic
3 - Full adoption	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Changes implemented in all areas • All components integrated into care process (i.e. orders, etc.) • Partial or complete closure of gap between baseline & target outcomes
