## Department of Health: Diabetes Epidemic Action Report



- Biannual report, developed by the DOH, DSHS, and HCA
- The report includes an overview of the issue, including the burden of disease, financial impact, and an overview of state programs
- The report offers several action steps for future work:
  - Including pharmacists on care teams
  - Support policies that compensate community health workers
  - Increase resources for monitoring and evaluating diabetes health status
  - Fund a study on barriers to care caused by out-of-pocket costs
  - Continue to fund existing initiatives that address social determinants of health
- Future versions of the report plan on including further information about social determinants and food/nutrition programs.

# Health Care Authority: Insulin Workgroup



- Proposing policy solutions to the state legislature on the total cost of insulin to society:
- Long-Term Policies:
  - Minnesota Example: Lower costs through manufacturer assistance programs.
  - Utah Example: Lower costs by expanding Public Health Employe Benefits (PHEB) to all Utah residents.
- Short-Term (Emergency Supplies) Policies:
  - Maine Example: Require manufacturers to reimburse an emergency supply of insulin for 30-days if required.
  - Utah Example: Allow pharmacists to dispense emergency supply of insulin without requiring verification.
- Final report to be published July 2023
