Public Responses-Chronic disease

Public Responses-Climate change



- Coping with extreme heat (clinical needs from providers, guidance from public health, resources from payers, best practices with heat advisories, equity lens) I have some interesting data from the APCD could share related to this topic too.
- **Decarbonization initiatives** (how the healthcare industry could collaborate to mitigate impacts and emissions) could have focus for example on inhaled anesthetics, or new clean building standards that are coming up
