SIDM DxQI Seed Grant Program discussion

Randy discussed SIDM DxQI Seed Grant Program. SIDM seeks to elevate the importance of addressing diagnostic error within healthcare delivery systems. Each award is capped at \$50,000 each, to support quality improvement teams based in care delivery systems doing specific quality improvement work directed towards improving diagnostic safety.

Grants will be awarded in the following categories:

- Serious misdiagnosis-related harms in malpractice claims: The “Big Three” – vascular events, infections, and cancers.
- Proposals that seek to reduce the risk of diagnostic error or delayed treatment and improve diagnostic quality outcomes related to health disparities associated with age, race/ethnicity, sex, and/or other social determinants of health
- Topics that do not address one of the previous two areas.
