We are pleased to invite interested speakers to submit proposals for presentations and posters at our 18th annual conference! We seek dynamic speakers to present on their knowledge of patient safety and effectively engage a diverse set of attendees in a virtual space.

We accept applicants from across the care spectrum and strongly encourage patients and family members to submit proposals about their experiences. This year's conference is a regional collaboration between Washington, Oregon, and British Columbia, and we welcome speakers with knowledge of the diversity of our Pacific Northwest Region.

A broad set of attendees represent healthcare stakeholders including:

- Clinical program leaders and frontline clinicians from across the spectrum of care
- Graduate and undergraduate health professions students
- Interested patients, family members of patients, and community members
- MPL claims representatives and insurance professionals
- Patient advocates and patient experience officers
- Patient and family advisory council members
- Patient safety practitioners, risk managers, quality leaders, and healthcare executives
- Regulators, public health departments, and public officials.

This year's conference welcomes a wide range of presentations. Suggested topics include:

- Community and Population Health Safety: Covid 19 exposed latent societal challenges (cultural, political etc.) to public health and safety as well as opened the door for innovation (telehealth, public health communication campaigns, etc.) What are best practices to address these issues?
- **COVID-19**: How the pandemic restructured health systems and exposed potential patient safety risks in workforce, care delivery, and capacity. We are especially interested in <u>long term care</u> experiences ensuring resident safety and <u>patient experience</u> with capacity disruptions.
- **Culture**, **Leadership**, **and Governance**: Building a culture of patient safety by engaging leaders and policymakers to demonstrate the deeply held professional commitment to safety.

- Health Equity and Disparities: Issues and solutions related to the impact of racism, bias, and social determinants on patient safety and quality.
- Nothing About Us Without Us: Successes and failures in collaborative healthcare interactions, outcomes, and experiences, prioritizing patient voices in healthcare.
- Patient and Family Engagement: Authentically reaching out to patients as partners in care and ensuring meaningful partnerships in all aspects of care design, delivery, and operations.

SPEAKERS

- The conference organizers seek speakers for 30-minute virtual breakout sessions on either Wednesday, October 6th or Thursday, October 7th.
- If a speaker proposal is accepted, the registration fees for speakers will be waived.
- Each speaker whose proposal is accepted will sign and return a Letter of Agreement by July 15, 2021 which specifies the timeline, responsibilities, and deliverables. If a speaker does not meet the conditions specified in the Letter, the conference organizers may rescind the invitation to speak.

POSTER PRESENTERS

- Posters provide a visual display describing innovative approaches to practice, education, or research via short written narratives, tables, graphs, pictures, and/or charts.
- In this virtual space, posters will be exhibited in a variety of formats on the conference web page. Poster formats may include but are not limited to: pdfs, recorded poster presentations, and/or images/graphics. Poster presenters are encouraged to be available for online Q&A before the plenary sessions and during breaks to discuss their project via chat.
- All posters must be free of commercial bias.
