Pulse's TakeCHARGE 2022 Kickoff Symposium: "Communication is Key" for Safer Health Care



On March 18-19, 2022 — coinciding with Patient Safety Awareness Week — Pulse Center for Patient Safety Education & Advocacy (Pulse CPSEA) will host a 2-day, all-virtual Symposium that also serves as the launchpad for the 2022 season of the *TakeCHARGE Campaign: 5 Steps to Safer*

Health Care — a nationwide public awareness effort started by Pulse and now promoted by a dozen organizations including the Washington Patient Safety Coalition. The event will have the theme, "Communication is Key."

The Symposium is open to all. It will be hosted on an online conference platform that closely replicates the experience of a real conference event, including "rooms" to meet and network with others, and the ability to visit sponsors' "booths". The presentations and resources will be available to attendees for three months after the event, which enjoys the backing of (among others) New York's Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, and Greater National Advocates (GNA).

Bradley Schwartz, Esq. of Greater National Advocates; Linda Kenney, Director of Peer Support Programs at the Betsy Lehman Center, and many others.

Linked to 5 Steps

Every presentation will be linked to one of the TakeCHARGE Campaign's "5 Steps" — completing advance directives, keeping a medical history and medication list, preparing questions before any medical visit, infection prevention via caregiver hand-washing, and using/being a patient advocate.

According to Pulse founder and president llene Corina, "We believe the TakeCHARGE Campaign teaches individuals how to become their own advocates, make informed decisions, communicate with clinicians and reduce the risk of personal injury from medical errors and misdiagnosis. This symposium also helps professional patient advocates and family members support a person using the healthcare system. By providing critical information and tools, Pulse and the TakeCHARGE Campaign empower individuals to become active partners in medical care, improving communication with clinicians and leading to higher satisfaction and safer care."
